The comprehensive **St. Joseph's Healthcare System** includes:

St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center: This academic tertiary care medical center and state designated trauma center, located on the Paterson campus, regularly accepts referrals of difficult or unusual cases from other hospitals and physicians and performs both complex and routine procedures. The Medical Center offers a full complement of specialty and subspecialty services including ambulatory, behavioral health, cardiovascular, oncology, orthopaedics, medicine, neurosciences, renal/nephrology, specialized surgery, trauma/emergency care, and women's services. The nursing team at St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center, which includes St. Joseph's Children's Hospital, has held the Magnet Award for Nursing Excellence, the profession's highest honor, since 1999, and is the recipient of the prestigious 2010 Magnet Prize™ - one of only 8 Magnet-designated hospitals to ever receive The Magnet Prize, and the only one worldwide to receive the 2010 award.

St. Joseph's Children's Hospital: This state designated specialized children's hospital at St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center provides advanced care for children from birth to 21-years-of-age. One of the first pediatric hospitals designated by the State, St. Joseph's offers a full spectrum of specialty and subspecialty services including Neonatal and Pediatric Intensive Care Units, a dedicated Pediatric Emergency Room as well as the Regional Craniofacial Center, Center for Feeding and Swallowing Disorders, Concussion Center, Cystic Fibrosis Center, and global telemedicine conferencing programs. Children's Hospital services are conveniently available in Clifton, Fairfield, Hoboken, Paterson, Rochelle Park, and Wayne.

St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital: A division of St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center, this acute care community hospital located in Wayne, New Jersey, offers a complete range of leading edge services that complement those provided at the Paterson campus, including cardiac catheterization, a diabetes center, imaging services, sleep center, acute rehabilitation center, geriatric services, and more.
