St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital: An Active Construction Site

Successful facilities investment projects have been readily visible on both St. Joseph's Healthcare System hospital campuses during the past several years.

To date, patients and staff alike at St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital have benefitted from renovation and expansion projects that have encompassed our Operating Room Suites, Pre- and Post-Operative Areas, our Critical Care Unit, and the Physicians Lounge. Upcoming interior renovations, a

component of St. Joseph's \$250 million master facilities plan, will provide a positive impact on nursing units throughout our hospital.

This Fall, the St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital campus will once again become an active construction site. Work will begin on two all new facilities: a comprehensive state-of-the-art Cancer Center will be built between the hospital and Hamburg Turnpike, and a Hospice Center will be built adjacent to our St. Joseph's Physicians Building. Slated for completion by 2013, these facilities will expand St. Joseph's clinical capabilities as we continue to meet the diverse needs of our community with specialized service provisions.

An expansive Emergency Department with separate pediatric, adult and geriatric units. State-of-the-art critical care floors. Advanced surgical suites. And a unique rooftop helipad. Our Critical Care Building will set new standards in patient care as the health care resource for the region.

Dear Friends,

These are truly historic times for St. Joseph's Healthcare System. With the newly expanded and renovated Operating Rooms and Critical Care Unit at St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital already in use, we have drastically improved the services we can provide to the community. In fact, due to the new state-of-the-art operating facilities, we have tripled the number of orthopaedic surgeries now performed here. The new Lobby and Critical Care Building at the Regional Medical Center are amazing and have transformed the hospital and the City of Paterson in a major way.

Recently, we celebrated the opening of the new Physicians Lounge at St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center and here in Wayne. In addition, we are in the process of updating the electronic health information technology system at both hospital campuses and later this year we will begin renovating our patient floors.

The St. Joseph's is the Future Capital Campaign is critical to the success of our expansion plans, representing \$50 million of the total project cost. To date, the campaign has secured over \$35.5 million of this goal. We are now in the Public Phase of our Capital Campaign, bringing our story to the community. In September 2010, we unveiled a bronze statue representing St. Joseph's featuring a physician, a Sister of Charity, a child and a senior patient. The statue is prominent as you enter the campus in Paterson and also in the lobby at our Wayne campus. It reminds us to never forget our mission and to remain grateful for the many blessings that we are able to provide to our patients, thanks to the tireless dedication of our sponsors, staff, physicians, volunteers and our most generous donors.

Planned Giving

Tax Free IRA

President Obama recently signed the extended charitable Individual Retirement Account (IRA) legislation restoring the IRA Charitable Rollover for 2010 and permitting its use through December 31, 2011. In enacting this charitable option, donors ages 70 ½ and older can move up to \$100,000 per year from their traditional or Roth IRA directly to an eligible charity, such as the St. Joseph s Wayne Hospital Foundation, without having to pay any additional income tax on the transferred money.

We encourage qualifying donors to take advantage of this great opportunity to make a gift supporting St. Joseph s Wayne Hospital, while reducing IRA assets that would either be taxed as income when withdrawn or subject to estate tax upon death.

Who is most likely to benefit from making such a rollover?

- Those who are required to make minimum withdrawals, but do not need additional income.
- Those whose major assets reside in the IRA and wish to make a charitable gift during their lifetime.
- Those who intend to leave all or a portion of their IRA to charity at death and wish to avoid the gift being diminished by estate taxes.
- Those who want to make a current charitable gift from IRA assets without the gift being diminished by income taxes.
- Those who want to see their IRA gifts impact a charity s mission and results now!

There are some restrictions that apply. Please note:

- You must be 70 ½ or older as of date of distribution.
- Qualifying gifts are limited to \$100,000 per year.
- You must transfer funds directly from IRA to St. Joseph s Wayne Hospital Foundation or your other favorite charity.
- Only outright gifts are eligible.
- IRA owners cannot claim an income tax deduction for this transfer, but the amount will not be realized as taxable income.
- This special provision only applies to Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs), not 401(k) plans or other tax-favored retirement planning vehicles.

In February of 1882, the hospital founded New Jersey's first school of nursing. Over the course of the next 88 years, the Greater Paterson School of Nursing awarded diplomas to 1,386 students.
